Impact of 'no deal' Brexit	
Each organisation represented on the PSB was invited to give an overview of their plans to prepare for Brexit and any implications of no-deal being agreed.	
Key issues highlighted across the partnership were:	
 Workforce implications and the EU citizen settlement scheme Civil contingencies, business continuity and emergency 	
management	
 Community cohesion Supply management (particularly medical supplies and food) 	
 Data security 	
 Transfer of legislative powers 	
Management and consistency of communications	
Discussion took place around the preparedness of the private sector	
in Cardiff, particularly in key areas such as Domiciliary Care providers.	
WLGA is testing reliance on EU nationals, but more general resilience exercises are being left to individual businesses.	
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Outline details of Settlement scheme were provided, including opportunities for support services to bid for grants from the Home Office.	
It was noted the Public Health Wales have undertaken an impact assessment on services across Wales. Details have not been publicised and currently sits with Health Minister for Wales.
