No. **Agenda Item** 1/2 **Welcome and Introductions** The Chair opened the meeting and noted apologies as above. Minutes from 29th September 2020 meeting were approved and the Chair provided an update against actions. 3. **Cardiff PSB Response to Climate Emergency** Gareth Harcombe, Cardiff Council Energy and Sustainability Manager provided an overview of 'One Planet Cardiff: Our vision for a Carbon Neutral City by 2030'. It was highlighted that PSB partners will have a key role in the Climate Emergency Board with suggested opportunities for collaboration: Land assets Circular Procurement Movement Local Area Energy Planning Divestment Social prescription PSB members agreed to supporting the development of a unified approach to 'One planet Cardiff' and welcomed involving utility companies and local academia in the work of the Climate Emergency Board. 4. Covid-19 Update Fiona Kinghorn provided an overview of the latest figures for Covid-19 in Cardiff, noting that the majority of cases are driven by the 17-24 population in Cardiff. Some cases are being seen in care homes and hospitals but the situation is considered stable. Key messages were highlighted from the Welsh Government Technical Advisory Cell Report: Coronavirus (COVID-19) and Health Inequalities the need to protect our most deprived population from the direct effects of Covid-19 but also from the indirect effects on the economy which will increase health inequalities in the longer term. Each organisation was given the opportunity to update on their response to announcement of a circuit breaker lockdown: Discussion was held on managing the transition out of the circuit breaker lockdown from 9 November onwards. South Wales Police is expecting an element of compliance fatigue. PSB partner views were welcomed to feed into discussions with Welsh Government going forward.
