	It was highlighted that a Public Toilet Strategy for Cardiff was being reviewed and aligned to link with the Age Friendly approach.

5.	Child Friendly City – path to accreditation	
	Mike Tate and Lee Patterson provided an overview of the work undertaken so far toward Child Friendly accreditation and next steps.	
	Next steps to include a refresh of the Child Friendly City Strategy (2018) and governance arrangements. It was noted that the refreshed strategy should align with Cardiff's strategy for youth services.	
	Discussion took place around the participation of young people at Cardiff PSB meetings. Some PSB members highlighted a preference for focussed engagement with young people (e.g. engagement on the PSB's Well-being Plan and Child Friendly City work) as discussions at the PSB level are suited to executives or their delegated representatives. The need to join up engagement/participation across the PSB and Regional Partnership Board was highlighted.	
	It was noted that Estyn's upcoming inspection will consider partnership working in Cardiff through the Child Friendly City work.
