4. Resilient Growth

Objective 2 – Cardiff's Population Growth will be managed in a Resilient Way

Gareth Newell gave a presentation outlining growth projections for Cardiff, highlighting in particular that:

- over the next 20 years Cardiff will grow faster than the rest of Wales combined
- growth will not evenly spread across age groups, with significant increases in the population of under 18s and over 65s.

John Hogg and Nadia de Longhi, gave a presentation on the implications of this population growth for Cardiff's Green Infrastructure, underlining to the PSB the importance of managing Cardiff's natural resources sustainably. They used the Greener Grangetown Project, a £2m partnership scheme which was visited by Members of the Board, to illustrate what can be achieved when we work together delivering multiple benefits. They explained how this retro-fit project could be scaled up and used as a template for future development in Cardiff.

A discussion followed on the role of the PSB in addressing this challenge, focussing on the need to ensure that building developments over the next 10-20 years include sustainable solutions and innovative technology.
