	Discussion was held on enforcement of Covid-19 restrictions and levels of compliance with quarantine instructions. Messaging needs to continue to emphasise personal responsibility of residents.	
4.	Partnership Restart and Recovery Update	
	Each organisation was given the opportunity to update on their respective restart and recovery actions.	
	 Key issues highlighted include: Escalation procedures are being developed in the event key trigger points towards reintroducing retrictions are hit The UHW CAV 24/7 Phone First system is up and running and receiving positive feedback Partners were praised for their work around domestic violence and abuse during lockdown
