Signficant progress made in understanding the needs of young people through taking a 'children first' approach. Strengthened leadership and joint working arrangements now better support those helping children to achieve better outcomes. Following the HMIP Joint Inspection in April 2022, Cardiff will not be subject to reinspection.
