



Story and context for current trend

Across Cardiff as a whole there has been a general increase of violence crime from 2014/15 to 2015/16, with a notable jump in the Cardiff South West area (1053 to 1276, an increase of 21.18%). This is set against a drop in other types of crime such as theft. Generally speaking this has tended to be in the Ely, Caerau and Canton wards, with reports of violent crime in Riverside generally remaining steady. However police reports indicate an issue with non-domestic violence in South Riverside and any links to football activity are under review.


Story and context for current trend

The map above illustrates the percentage of adults reporting very heavy drinking in Cardiff USOAs for 2008-12, (most recent data). Over this period for men, drinking more than 12 units on the heaviest drinking day in the previous week and for women drinking more than 9 units on the heaviest drinking day in the previous week. Rates of heavy drinking in Canton and Riverside appear higher than average, with implications for health and both domestic and non-domestic violence.


Issue: Teenage Pregnancy

Story and context for current trend

The map above shows the comparative rate of teenage pregnancies through Cardiff and the Vale from 2010-2012, (latest available figures). Although a very low percentage of mothers at this time were aged between 15-17, the total in Ely and Caerau wards were amongst the highest throughout Cardiff and the Vale and significantly high when presented against Wales as a whole. (NB some ward information has been suppressed due to the very low numbers in these areas).

Milestones Achieved

ID	Milestones Achieved in this reporting period
1.5	<p>C-Card Scheme</p> <p>On 23rd and 24th March, C-Card Training facilitated by the YMCA was held for 9 participants from organisations including South Wales Police, Westway Surgery, Cadwyn Housing Association and Communities First. As a result, it is hoped there will be one new C-Card point open to patients at Westway Surgery. Further interest has been received from additional Cardiff South West doctor surgeries and BRG Communities First who will be signposted to further C-Card training from September 2016. A new Canton based contact from Barnardos has also been established with existing training. They have been linked in with the YMCA scheme and it is hoped this will provide an additional C-Card point.</p>
1.6	<p>WRAP Training</p> <p>On 23rd March WRAP, (workshop to raise awareness of Prevent), training was delivered to 31 participants from organisations including South Wales Police, Taff Housing, Cardiff City FC Foundation, Flying Start and the City of Cardiff Council.</p>
2.1	<p>Social Prescribing</p> <p>On 4th March, partners from BRG Communities First, Public Health, St David's Court Surgery and the Neighbourhood Partnership met and agreed to initiate a second Social Prescribing trial planned for April 2016 in the Riverside area. This will be informed a great deal by the first trial of social prescribing in Caerau Lane Surgery and encourage new links between surgery staff, Communities First and other partner organisations in the area.</p>
2.3	<p>Active Travel</p> <p>On 7th and 9th March, Severn Road Primary trialled a park and stride in partnership with City of Cardiff Council, Living Streets and South Wales Police. In all approximately 40 pupils took part and this scheme will continue every Monday and Wednesday morning for the foreseeable future.</p>

3.3	Citizen Engagement Factsheets Contributions to a series of “How To” citizen engagement factsheets have been received from Neighbourhood Watch, Keep Wales Tidy and VCS Cymru. Further factsheet contributions are being sought from additional partners before publishing to the general public.
Misc.	City of Cardiff Budget Savings Proposals Consultations City of Cardiff Council Budget Savings Proposals Consultation events were held in December and the first week in January in Chapter Arts Centre, Western Leisure Centre, Ely and Caerau Community Hub and Dusty Forge facilitated by the Neighbourhood Partnership Officer.
Misc.	Action Plan Review On 24th March the Cardiff South West Neighbourhood Partnership held an annual action plan review at Chapter Arts Centre. 14 participants attended from partner organisations such as Sport Cardiff, Communities First, South Wales Police and Cardiff & Vale UHB.
Misc.	St Timothy’s Church On 19th February a meeting was held with United Welsh and representatives from St Timothy’s Church in order to explore funding opportunities linking in with a nearby development. The St Timothy’s group will undertake a questionnaire survey with users of the facility to agree project ideas, including upgrading of the hall floor, (used by Flying Start), replacing windows or developing the garden and grounds for community use.
Misc.	Neighbourhood Partnership Fund – Successful Applications 3 additional applications were received for the Cardiff South West Neighbourhood Partnership Fund during this period. All 3 projects, covering a variety of Cardiff City and South priorities, were successful and received financial support.
Misc.	Neighbourhood Partnership Fund - Monitoring The majority of monitoring has been received from each successful applicant to the 2015/16 fund. There are however 4 organisations that have yet to submit monitoring. The Neighbourhood Partnership Officer is working with these organisations to assist project completion. The monitoring is being used to inform case studies for the annual review.

Ely & Caerau Place-Making Installation of community asset signs and noticeboards in positions chosen by local residents.	Scheme delayed due to capacity issues, however design of a noticeboard and location of community asset signposts have been agreed with community groups. This delay may prove a risk to funding from the 2015-16 City of Cardiff Council heritage budget, however CAER Heritage currently looking into options for an extension.
Childcare Solutions Workshop Supporting Families sub-group and relevant partners to take part in a workshop aimed at exploring solutions to the expense of childcare, with an aim to agree a trial idea and case study.	Planning meeting held on 10 th March with members of the Supporting Families sub-group, however plans to deliver the workshop have been pushed back to Quarter 1 2016-17 due to availability.
MECC Training for Pharmacists Arrange for Cardiff South West located pharmacists to take MECC, (making Every Contact Count), training and encourage each pharmacy to have a contact specialising in community group work.	Changes made to Cardiff South West GP Cluster agenda means a date to discuss linking in with pharmacists will be moved to later in 2016.
Incredible Edible Ely IEE Group to initiate new propaganda gardens using local volunteers and partner organisation’s available space.	Although agreement to place propaganda gardens was obtained for Ely Police Station and Western Leisure Centre, the Incredible Edible Ely group failed to form. Work will be undertaken to form new community garden projects as part of the 2016/17 action plan.
